WHEREAS, Associated General Contractors New Mexico (AGC New Mexico) has distinguished itself for 75 years as a voice of the commercial construction industry in New Mexico: and

WHEREAS, the work done by AGC New Mexico promotes the employment and advancement of skilled women in the construction industry and benefits New Mexico through community development and educational programs; and

WHEREAS, women make up approximately 11% of the construction industry in the United States and earn 99.1% of what men earn on average as compared to 81.1% in other industries; and

WHEREAS, the construction community, which includes general contractors, specialty contractors, and suppliers of materials, equipment, or services to the construction profession, has been a driving force in proudly building commercial construction projects across our state; and


Mistakes are unavoidable. They are necessary to professional growth. Find solutions, take ownership, and move on.

THE BIGGEST LESSON YOU LEARNED THE HARD WAY?

Delegating can be hard! When you delegate an activity or task, you still have a responsibility to ensure it gets accomplished. I learned others don't always understand your intentions when you delegate (some can perceive it as you avoiding doing something you don't want to do), so you have to be explicit with your direction and still stay connected throughout the delivery of the task.

WHEN YOU STARTED YOUR JOB OR GOT INTO THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY WHAT DO YOU WISH YOU WOULD HAVE KNOWN?

I wish I'd have known all the opportunities that would lie ahead. I've learned how interconnected the Architect/Engineer/Contractor/Owner relationship is an how delicate the ecosystem is that they all operate within. It's fascinating to be able to experience and contribute to the construction industry from so many "angles"

BEST ADVICE YOU'VE BEEN GIVEN?

"You manage things and you lead people." This has stuck with me for some time, mostly because it's so simple to remember and is such a profound declaration - leadership is just as much about others as it is about you.

HOW DO YOU BEST MANAGE YOUR TIME?

I've been able to block and protect time each Monday morning to look at the week ahead and mentally prepare or develop a quick action plan for what I need to do immediately, what I can delegate and what I can defer for when I have more heads-down time.
